Mark's Quilt Shop Guide:

The Sewing Basket Prosser, WA

If you have been quilting very long in the Tri-Cities area you have probably been to the Sewing Basket on Wine Country Road in Prosser, WA. And especially if you have needed fabric of just the right color, just the right print, just the right sparkle, or chickens, or cows, or polka dots, or whatever.

The Sewing Basket is owned and operated by Marilyn and Ben Dalstra. They started out with a family dairy farm for 27 years, and then 22 years ago started up the Sewing Basket. It started out small and has been growing ever since. Five years ago they opened up the 'Annex', the building in the rear behind the storefront facing right on Wine Country Road. Ben taught agricultural sciences in the Pasco school district until he retired five years ago and now helps out at the Sewing Basket.

I asked Marilyn what they specialize in, and there was a pause, and she said "everything." I can't imagine how Marilyn does it, but she keeps track of all 11,000 to 12,000 bolts of fabric. There is a food section, a 'blender' section, a polka dot section, a farm animal section, reproduction fabric, and more batiks, Christmas, and Halloween fabrics than you can imagine. Currently they have 7,500 fabrics online and when an order comes in Marilyn has to remember where every bolt is stashed. Over half the fabric sales are now online purchases

Twelve years ago they purchased the building next door on the Yakima River and turned it into a six bedroom, four bath, bed and breakfast. They specialize in quilt retreats, and best part is the fabric store is right next door! Stay tuned for BIG plans for the future, as Ben and Marilyn have a special treat in store for us quilters.

COMMUNITY SERVICE BLOCK JANUARY-FEBRUARY 2017

Mega Mug- Makes a 9.5-inch Square UNfinished, 9-inch finished

Time to be sipping hot ones! This is an original pattern, inspired by the cold weather in December. The handle can be to the left or to the right, depending on how you hold yours!

Two fabrics are used for each block, to be available at the meeting.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

From background fabric, cut:

For Handle Section:

Two 1.5" squares One 4" x 2" rectangle

For Borders:

Two 9.5" x 2" rectangles One (bottom) 6.5" x 1.5" One (top) 6.5" x 3"

From featured fabric, cut:

MegaMug:

One 4" x 6" mug Two 1.5" x 3" top/bottom of handle One 1.5" x 4" handle

SEWING INSTRUCTIONS:

Lay out the cut pieces.

Sew the handle: first the vertical section, then add the corners to the top and bottom of the handle, paying attention to the angles.

Add the top and bottom of the handle to the vertical part.

Note: press all seams to the mug, to make it stand out.

Sew the top and bottom borders to the mug, then add the two side pieces.

Beginning in October, the group has a new format: Lunch and Learn!


The CS committee will be sharing new ways to stack, whack, stitch and create quilts for our community. Learn new blocks and easy techniques for fun quilting.


