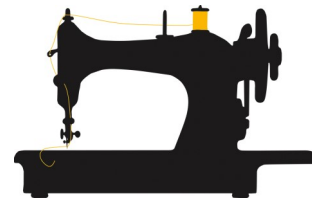

Each quilt entered in our March Show **must** have a sleeve if it is 50" to 85" wide. For instructions on how to construct a sleeve, be it temporary to be removed after the show or for more permanent purposes, please visit our website at

This will make a 4"-wide sleeve suitable for all quilt show venues.

Premade sleeves are also available for purchase at meetings and at White Bluffs Quilt Museum for \$5. They are 84" long and can be cut to fit your entry.

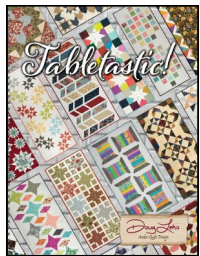

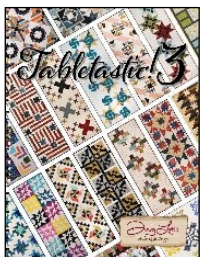

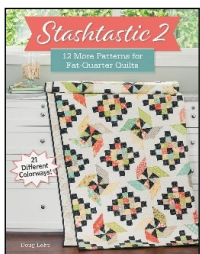

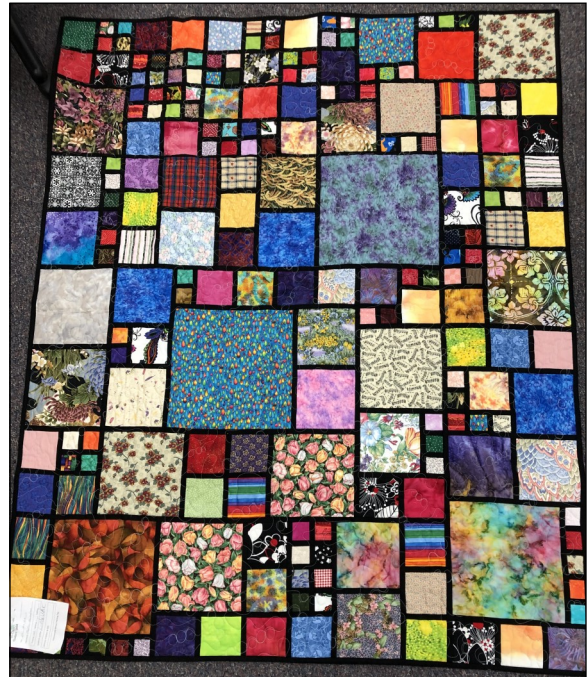

Do you recognize yourself in any of these?

The Appreciator: This quilter just loves to make quilts, loves to see other people make quilts, and loves to cheer people on as they make quilts.
