

In Memoriam: We Remember Eula Dewitz

Virginia Treadway's interview from Quilters' Press 2004:

"Quilters are the hardest working women in the world. They are generous with their time and their help." This clearly describes Eula Dewitz. She has been a Guild member since 1989. With over 100 years of family quilting history, Eula began making nine patches with her grandmother when she was 8. Later, she was allowed to use a treadle machine. During WWII, fabric was scarce. "I remember when my mother went to town, if the store had a bolt of green, it didn't matter whether you liked green or not, you bought it. Hopefully, if you didn't like green, you could trade with someone else."

However, my quilts were all utility quilts so I didn't have one to show. In 1946, I made a pieced top for my high school girl friend. Stored it in her cedar chest, it was the most pitiful thing -- hair on the back from not trimming the threads, points cut off, etc. After the show, I repaired, washed, and quilted it for her. It was a fun exhibit and everyone had pitiful first quilts with tucks, cut off points, and poor binding. We all have to start somewhere."

Retirement from Hanford, has been good for Eula. The truth is, she just started doing a different kind of work. A Board member at the Union Gospel Mission, she does volunteer work for many schools and community projects. Last year, she completed 15 quilts for the mission.

Eula quilts on a Pfaff Tiptronic 6270 with a quarter inch foot. She loves the ease of the unique walking foot. She enjoys hand quilting, but relies on others to do some of her quilting. "The last quilt I've done is my favorite, and I'm hot to start the next one. I do what turns me on. Scrap quilts are my favorite quilts."

"Every day that I get up and am able to work, I am happy. Work is a blessing. We are so fortunate today to have glasses and pain relievers. We can be productive for many years. That's a blessing, to be able to work and enjoy your grand children."

"There is room for everyone in the TCQG. Beginners, intermediates, experts -- all are welcome. There are women who make big quilts, art quilts and everything in between. All are different and all are welcome. Quilters are the hardest working women in the world."

I knew Eula since the late 80's....she was such a sweet person and so friendly, and made me feel so welcome when I first joined the guild. I got to know her and there was a group of us that formed a friendship group and met at Eula's home to sew and visit. She had a great sense of humor. I went to this last fall retreat and we got to visit and celebrate her 90th birthday. She was just a lovely person and she will be missed.

January 2017

The meeting was called to order at 6:38 p.m. by President Jean Keaveney. Board Secretary Ardith Eakin took the minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Chris Cowan, Treasurer, reported that ending balances for the month of December are:

 Checking \$20,012.09

• Money Market \$19,477.92

Chris shared copies of officers' 2017 budget, 2016 Profit and Loss report, and the 2017 Quilt Show budget.

Membership: Membership chair Floriene Turlington reported that due to inclement weather and low attendance, only 70 paid members have renewed. Floreine will take memberships at upcoming meetings.

White Bluffs Liaison: Jo Matthias reminded members of the White Bluffs Shop Hop, to be held January 28. 13 shops are participating.

Quilt Show: Laurel Sutton reported the show is coming soon and everything is coming together. The posters are to the shops, she has received emails about two buses coming, and show information has been sent to seventy guilds. She still needs a reader board contact person. Also, the volunteer sign up sheets for the show need to be at the meetings.

Community Service: Cyndy Underwood reported the goal for 2017 is 275 quilts. February is an in between month with sewing between the two meetings.

Retreat: The spring retreat will be the same as last year. Due to a significant increase in costs at the current location, the spring retreat in 2018 will be at a new location.

Workshops: Jo Matthias had been asked about Presto, a family album quilting workshop, and it is not possible as the presenter lives in New York and would be too expensive. Joe Cunningham will not be available in September as earlier mentioned. He is the featured artist this year at the Walla Walla show.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:35 p.m.; next board meeting will be Monday, February 13, at 6:30 p.m. at White Bluffs.

February 2017

The meeting was called to order at 6:34 p.m. by President Jean Keaveney. Board Secretary Ardith Eakin took the minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Chris Cowan, Treasurer, reported that ending balances for the month of January are:

 Checking \$23,193.90

• Money Market \$20,012.43

Membership: Floreine stated she did not have a current membership number to report. Jean Keaveney spoke to having the membership year changed from January 1 - December 31 to April 1 - March 31. This would require a by-laws change and will be discussed more later on during the by-laws review.

AM/PM Secretaries: Jean Zoet shared that she is going to use a rolling slide show to remind members to sign in, pay membership dues, etc. This will run during the half hour social time before the meeting.

Quilt Show: Laurel shared that the show is listed in the new Country Register and Entertainer. In other areas, the silent auction is moving along, signs are out of storage, and program books are progressing.

Toni Jones reported on the registration for the show, with 161 entries to date. Toni noted that over 1/3rd of the membership challenge entrants have not yet renewed their membership.

Community Service: Starting in April Cyndy will bring community service quilts to the meetings so various members can deliver them to the agencies.

Retreat: Spring retreat is full but there is a possibility of a day camp with members providing their own sleeping accommodations.

Workshops: Jo Matthias is working on a crazy quilter and embroidery workshop plus a portraits workshop.

New Business: Eula Dewitz recently passed away and she will be mentioned in the next newsletter. Her membership status was clarified and no refund is needed.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:20 p.m.; next board meeting will be Monday, March 13, at 6:30 p.m. at White Bluffs.
